TRUSTEES' REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

AIMS Mission Statement

To clarify AIMS' focus for both volunteers and users of our services, we use the mission statement which was adopted last year. "We support all maternity service users to navigate the system as it exists, and campaign for a system which truly meets the needs of all." We intend to use this mission statement as a guide to prioritise our activities.

Objectives and Activities

The objects of AIMS are, insofar as the following relate to the improvement of the provision of maternity and maternity related health services, pregnancy, childbirth, the postnatal period and early parenthood:

1. to advance, preserve and protect the mental, emotional and physical health of women;
2. to advance, preserve and protect the mental, emotional and physical health of families, parents and children;
3. to advance the education of the public, including healthcare professionals;
4. to promote human rights (as set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women and subsequent United Nations conventions and declarations, and the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms) in the United Kingdom.

The provision of high quality, safe and legally compliant maternity services is for the public benefit as it is in society's interest that maternity services function in such a way that the mental, emotional and physical health of pregnant women, parents, children and their families are advanced and preserved. All our activities have been geared towards promoting this goal. In planning our activities for the year at the meetings of the trustees we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Volunteers

The Trustees are very pleased and grateful that AIMS has been able to attract a growing number of active volunteers over the last year, joining sub-groups working on the AIMS Journal, website, publications, campaigning and staffing the AIMS helpline. These sub-groups are in addition to ones to deal with finance, administration and the membership. We have held two Volunteers meetings this year, helping us to put names to faces, and giving us time to review where AIMS is now and how we want to move forward.

Paid Staff

We have for the first time taken on a paid member of staff. The role is a part time home based Office Manager who is able to provide regular support for both Trustees and Volunteers, thus enabling us to achieve a better level of organisation which is enabling us to better work towards the AIMS mission.

AIMS Journal

Four issues of the AIMS Journal have been published online this year, covering Birth Trauma, Infant Feeding, Twins and Better Births and NHS England's Maternity Transformation process. Making the Journal Open Access means that all articles are accessible to everyone and that we are not hiding information behind a paywall. We have also made many articles from the last 20 years of the print Journal available online, and we will continue to add more of this back catalogue.

Helpline

The AIMS helpline is unique in its ability to support women across the UK from a lay perspective, with the experience that only comes from decades of supporting women through thousands of different situations. The Volunteers have responded to more than 400 enquiries this year, and have developed a resource of information which addresses frequently asked questions which includes information on more than 75 issues, and now provides a starting point for many responses. Work has now started to use this resource as a starting point for writing more Birth Information covering these topics on the AIMS website.

Consultations and campaigning

In addition to providing feedback on various consultations from official bodies, such as NICE and MBRRACE-UK, other activities have included

- Publishing a statement giving our definition of Continuity of Carer (www.aims.org.uk/campaigning/item/implementingbetterbirthscontinuityofcarer)
- Publishing comments on the MBRRACE report "Saving Lives, Improving Mothers' Care"
- Providing support to others campaigning on a variety of issues including those campaigning to prevent the closure of birth centres around the country. This year we plan to continue our focus on campaigning to shift the UK maternity services towards a service which offers real continuity of care for every woman.

Publishing

AIMS Publications continue to be an important source of information for expectant parents and those supporting them. We have now engaged authors to write a series of new publications some of which will replace books which we currently sell, but also others which will be covering topics we have not dealt with before. These will provide up to date information in a format which we believe will make them easier to read and hence more accessible and attractive to a wider audience. A new cover design has been developed for this new series of books by an AIMS supporter without any charge. This will make this new series of AIMS book easily identifiable.

Financial Review

Membership and the Journal

Members' subscriptions continue to provide the backbone of our funding and raised the sum of £9,551 (2018 -: £10,932). There has been a reduction in membership income, which is partly accounted for by the loss of a number of institutional members following the decision to make the Journal open access. This is more than offset by the reduction in the costs of producing the Journal now that we no longer have to pay to have it printed and posted out. In the last full year of printing the Journal (2017) the cost was £9,330 but the current year's cost of publishing online was only £4,034, allowing more of the membership subscriptions to be spent on core activities.

Publications

Income from sales of publications is slightly lower than the previous year at £14,291 (2018 - £17,826). Sales are generally increased by the publication of new titles or new editions and we anticipate the publication of new books next year. Publications are vital for women to access and we are pleased to have a rolling programme of new books. We are very aware of keeping prices affordable, so the prices of our publications have not gone up for many years now. The book 'bundles' also offer excellent value and are very popular.

Costs

Support costs, excluding the journal and newsletter and the conference in the prior year, were £11,123, £1,776 up from the prior year (2018 - £9,347), largely due to the cost of recruiting our new member of staff, who started work in February 2019.

Reserves and Restricted Funds

The reserves policy is that sufficient reserves should be held to fund six months' activities. At least this amount is held in a separate bank account. At 31 March the balance in this account was £23,840.

Funds that were raised specifically for the new website were held in a restricted fund which was closed during the year after the website became operational.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Association is a Charity Incorporated Organisation (CIO), governed by a constitution dated 16th June 2014.

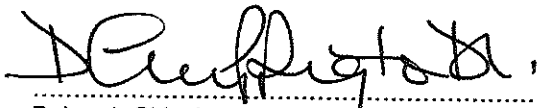
All the current trustees have been elected at this year's or previous AGMs except for Nadia Higson, who was appointed by the trustees in November 2017. Trustees may also be appointed by the members at any time. By the terms of the constitution, no trustee may be a qualified member of any medical profession including doctor, midwife, nurse or health visitor.

Trustees are regularly informed of the responsibilities of their role. Training is provided to trustees and other volunteers who answer helpline calls or emails. There were no serious incidents or other matters such that the trustees should have reported to the Charities Commission but have not done so.

Debbie Chippington Derrick remained as Chair of Trustees for a second year following the 2018 AGM.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have been applied consistently throughout the period and the previous year.

Basis of preparation and assessment of going concern

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transactions value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102, Section 1A) and with the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

General Information

The charity is a Charity Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in England and Wales with charity number 1157845. Its registered office is 1 Carlton Close, Camberley, Surrey, GU15 1DS. The trustees are named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member of the charity.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £.

Recognition of income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donations are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that those conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Membership subscriptions received in the nature of a gift are recognised in donations.

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any gift aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation unless the donor or the terms of the appeal have specified otherwise.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses including support costs and governance costs are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure heading. See note 6 for more information.

Charitable costs relate to any costs incurred by the charity whilst working towards meeting its objectives.

Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support, on the basis of time spent.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

Other support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

The irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of expenditure for which it was incurred.

Intangible fixed assets

Intangible fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended by management.

Intangible fixed assets are amortised over the expected useful economic life of 4 years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Office equipment - 25% on cost

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

At each reporting date, property, plant and equipment are reviewed to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If there is an indication of possible impairment, the recoverable amount of any affected asset is estimated and compared with its carrying amount. If the estimated recoverable amount is lower, the carrying amount is reduced to its estimated recoverable amount, and an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income statement.

If an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but not in excess of the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset in prior years. A reversal of impairment is recognised immediately in the income statement.

Stocks

Stocks held for resale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount after any trade discounts or amount advanced by the charity. Subsequently, they are measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at banks and in hand and short term deposits with an original maturity date of three months or less.

Creditors

The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amount less any trade discounts.

Funds

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor or trust deed. There is a single restricted fund for donations to the new AIMS website, enabling the trustees to provide a professionally constructed website using up to date technology for use on a desktop, laptop or phone.

Unrestricted income funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use for any purpose in furtherance of the charitable objects.
